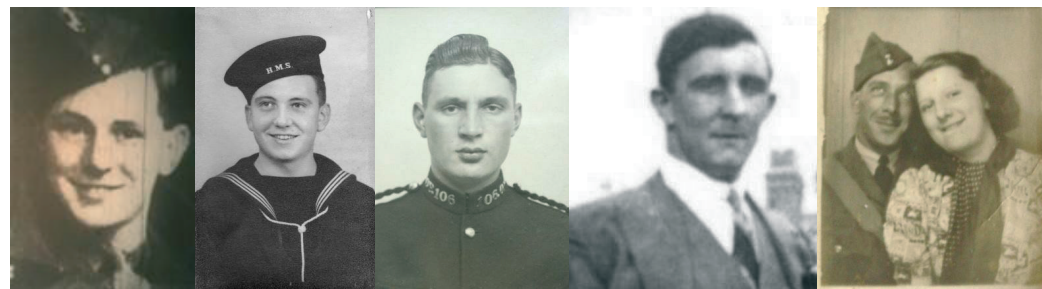

A free exhibition to commemorate the men
from South Oxford who are named on the St Matthew's
Second World War memorial

The exhibition is part of a community history project to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the end of the Second World War.
